Hamburger:

Olsen Farm beef patty or vegan mushroom lentil patty on house-made bun with lettuce, tomato, ketchup, house-made vegan cheese optional

Beef Patty: Olsen Farm grass fed and finished 85/15 ground beef, sea salt, organic black pepper

Vegan Patty: organic crimini and shiitake mushrooms, red lentils, organic onion, organic extra virgin olive oil, organic buckwheat sourdough bread crumbs, chia seeds, Yoka Miso chickpea miso, mushroom powder, garlic powder, organic smoked paprika, organic black pepper, sea salt

Millet Teff Bun: organic millet flour, grape seed oil, ivory teff flour, sweet potato starch, organic tapioca starch, organic psyllium, yeast, salt

Cheese: organic coconut yogurt, hemp milk, organic tapioca starch, nutritional yeast, avocado oil, salt, organic paprika, onion powder, garlic powder, mushroom powder

Sweet Potato Fries Ingredients: organic Farias Farm (of Viva Farms) sweet potatoes, avocado oil, sweet potato starch, organic paprika, onion powder, garlic powder, organic oregano, sea salt, organic black pepper
